

Water Safety Policy

Water activities provide children with opportunities to access a variety of experiences for learning and fun. Cobbler Creek OSHC recognises the risks posed by bodies of water and takes the safety of children and educators involved in water-based activities and around bodies of water seriously. Every precaution is taken so that children are able to enjoy water-based activities safely. Risk assessments will be carried out for programmed water-based activities.

Cobbler Creek OSHC will ensure the safety of children around bodies of water by:

- Undertaking a risk assessment for the prosed activity
- Ensuring educators are placed in positions that allow them to directly and actively supervise any child accessing a body of water.
- Using venues that provide additional supervision in form of life guards

Definition of a body of water

The service recognises the following locations are bodies of water:

- Swimming pools
- Wading pools
- Lakes
- Ponds
- The sea
- Creeks
- Dams
- Rivers
- Equipment used by the service that could contain 5cm or more of water and would allow a child to submerge both nose and mouth at the same time

The number of Educators present is to be determined by a risk assessment of the proposed activity. The adequacy of supervision and educators present during water-based activities shall be determined by:

- Numbers, ages and abilities of the children
- Number and positioning of Educators
- Areas where children are playing, in particular the visibility and accessibility of these areas
- Risk in the environment and experiences provided to children

The Director/Assistant Director

The Director/Assistant Director is responsible for:

- Looking for venues that provide additional supervision
- Conducting a risk assessment on any venue the service plans to visit, to ensure that the service is able to provide appropriate levels of supervision
- Ensuring a risk assessment is carried out on any activity the service sets up that allows children to access a body of water
- Ensuring educators position themselves in the environment so that every child is within sight of an Educator at all times and supervision is direct and vigilant
- On a swimming excursion, having some educators designated to supervise children from within the body of water
